Minutes

- The formal meeting was called to order by President Alice Nicholson at 7:02PM with 6 attendees.
- <u>MOTION</u>: A motion was made and seconded to approve the March Membership Meeting Minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

Equipment

• A hand truck is now available for use by the club. Typical uses would include moving garbage cans, tables, or potentially tunnels... or anything else. This is in addition to the flat bed carts. The hand truck can go in the trailer for shows.

Availability of Equipment for Beginning Students

• All of the equipment made from the last equipment day has been sold.

- Some additional equipment has been stored off-site. Alice will retrieve it and make it available for sale.
- Maida has agreed to hold an equipment day in October to make equipment for the Beginner I students to accommodate a new method of the "Value of a Jump".

Teeter Trainer

- Discussion regarding the pros and cons of potentially using a teeter trainer rather than a chair for training the teeter.
- The teeter trainer is commonly used on the opposite end of the teeter (the down side) which leaves the dog having to jump (or be lifted) off of the end.
- A suggestion was made to use the teeter trainer in the same manner as the chair (on the up
 end) so that there would be multiple levels to graduate a dog through. The dog would still be
 placed on the teeter at the beginning and ride the teeter to the ground to get off. The distance
 to the ground would start out smaller and then grow.
- Billie will research the idea.

Tunnel Bags

- Need to have enough tunnel bags at the Patch to set a tunneler's course-- at least 18 sets (36 bags) are needed.
- Over the summer, bags from the NADAC trailer could be used. Inventory of the trailer will be done again at the beginning of the season.

Patch Maintenance

- Alex began installing the new LED lights April 10th. They should make a big difference at the

- Ron Boe provided an estimate to fix the tunnel shed on the advanced side (\$75). The shed leaked during the last rain storm such that water got into the shed and over the tunnels and floor. Ron has been given the go ahead and will fix the shed before the next monsoon season.

Classes

• There are 175 dogs registered for the last session of the season. This is a good number given that many winter visitors have gone.

Foundation

- Billie, Myra and Ilyse met to discuss the restructuring of the Foundation Class.
- Increased focus on focus work and impulse control.
- Foundation will no longer end with Beginner Test, so that the focus for the end of the class can be preparing for Beginner 1 rather than for the test.
- Beginner agility test will occur with Beginner 1 class instead.
- Ilyse will be rewriting the foundation plan between now and August.

Beginner 1

- There are 22 students in Beginner 1. This is the first time that EVERYONE from Foundation is moving on to Beginner 1. Additionally a few other students will be in the class.
